| 3.1 Evaluate the risk of fire occurring | visits to stationary cars | visits to cars which are in operation | If vehicles sited too close to fuel containers |
| 3.2 Evaluate the risk to people from a fire starting in a building. | Visitors not entering any buildings (most likely situation) | Potential for fire spread from other vehicles or stalls. | Visitors seated in vehicles which are running |
| 3.3 Remove & Reduce hazards that may cause fire | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ensure all drivers of show vehicles remove waste and not have fuel in cans etc. 2. Control with marshals the entrance and exit of show vehicles, leaving a space between moving vehicles. 3. Store any spare fuel in a safe space & prohibit smoking nearby. 4. Ensure separation space between parked vehicles (As agreed with the event organisers site plan) 5. Stewards to patrol site at regular hourly periods & to remove any hazardous waste. | | |
| 3.4 remove & reduce the risks to people from a fire | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ensure clear 'fire routes' in line with the Event organisers evacuation plans. 2. Minimise the start up of show vehicles as per Event organiser's plans. 3. Ensure fire extinguishers are in catering areas. 4. Regularly patrol all areas to ensure guidelines are being adhered to. 5. Provide site wide fire warning system in line with the Event organisers evacuation plans. 6. Ensure good communication between stewards with extra training to ensure early warning of fire is given. 7. Introduce regular fire patrols to monitor hazardous activities | | |
